



- ☐ The tropics are active, no immediate threats









 Hot temperatures expected today and Friday with most areas in the 90s. Luckily the humidity is not too oppressive, so Heat Index values don't break 105F.



Day 6-10 Temperature Outlook




 It has been hot this week and this will continue through Sunday, then trending back towards normal temperatures

- Closely watching the disturbance (98L) expected to move into the Caribbean but we are still too far out to know any specifics.

We Are Here

Getting a better idea of possibilities, but still too soon to narrow down any specific details

What you should do:

- Monitor official forecasts
- Review plans
- Refresh supplies

Beginning to narrow down possible impacts to more specific areas

What you should do:

- Pay close attention to the official forecast for changes
- Review plans and refresh supplies
- Start planning for possible evacuation

Potential impacts to specific areas, onset times, etc.

What you should do:

- Pay close attention to the official forecast for any changes to expected impacts
- Evacuate if asked to do so by local officials
- Enact your plans for preparing your home and family



- Hot for another couple days, then trending down some
- Tropics are active, but no threats for at least 7 days
 - It is still too far in advance to know where disturbance 98L will go, once an actual storm forms we will start to get more specific details
