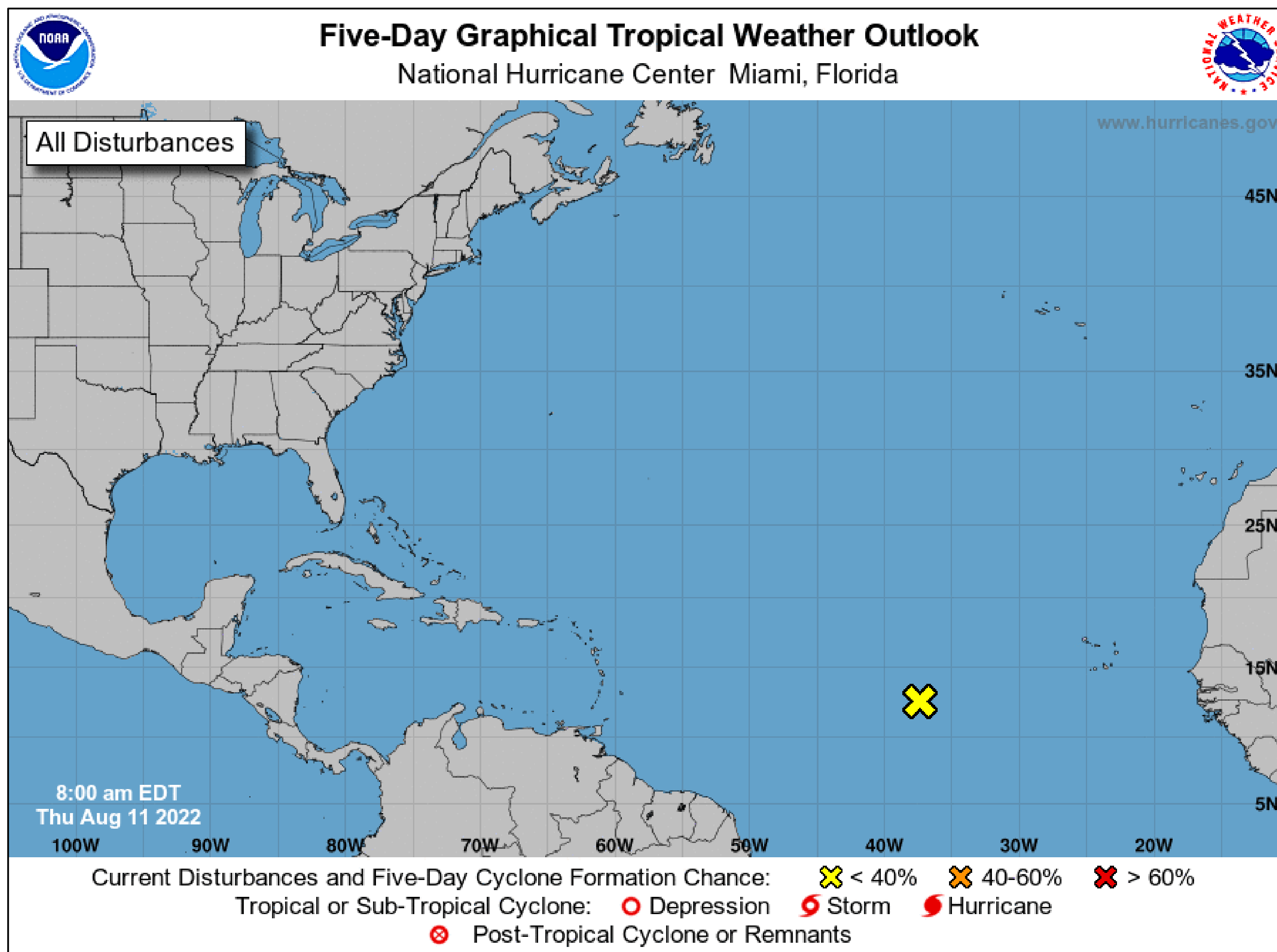


- Daily shower and T'storm chances continue (locally heavy rainfall possible)
- Coastal Flood impacts begin to decrease
- Slightly less coverage of showers and T'storms early and mid week next week
- Pretty much the same story different week

Tropical Weather Outlook



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- A tropical wave is forecast to move into less favorable conditions west of the islands.
- The tropical Atlantic is forecast to remain quiet over the next 5 days

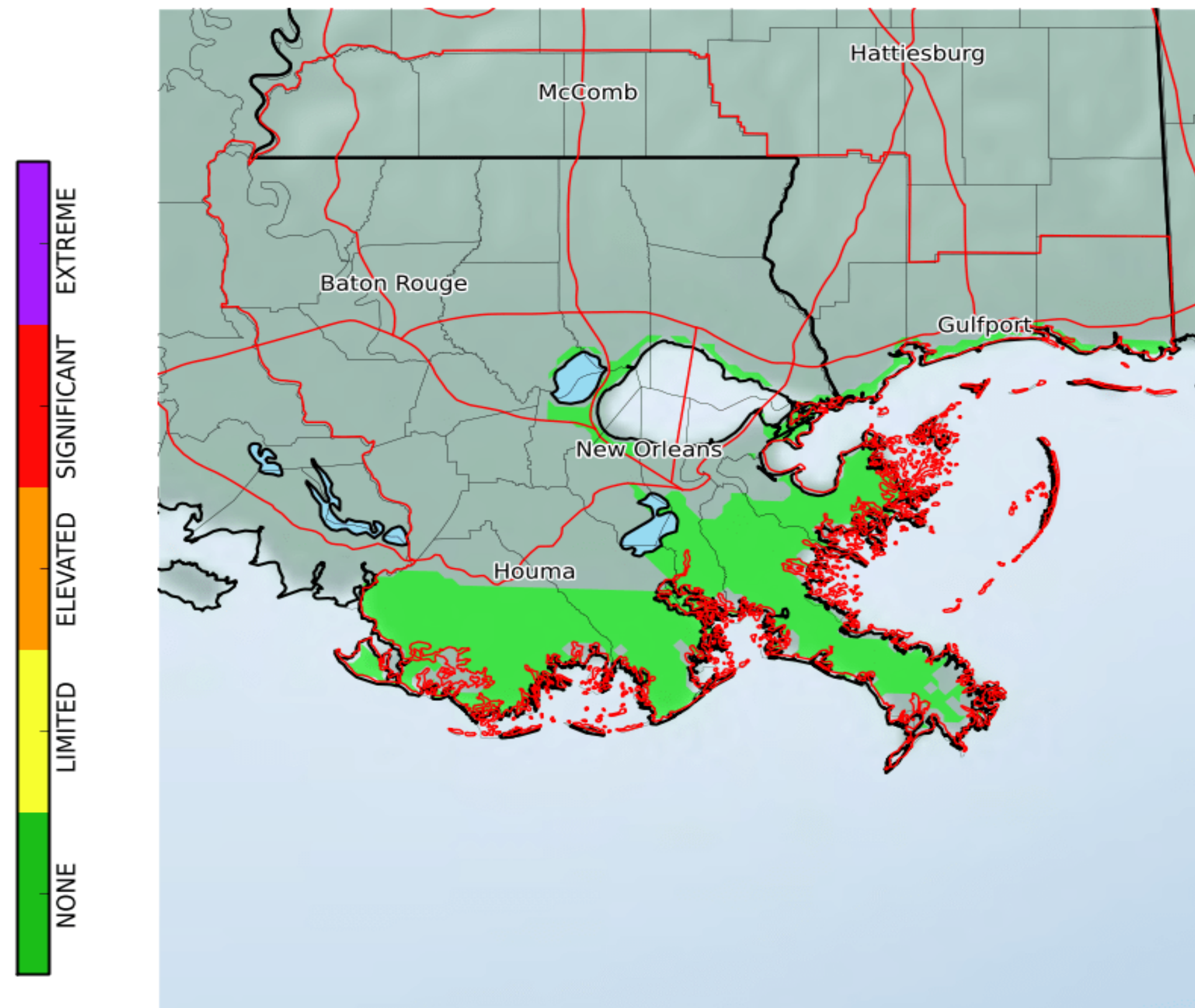

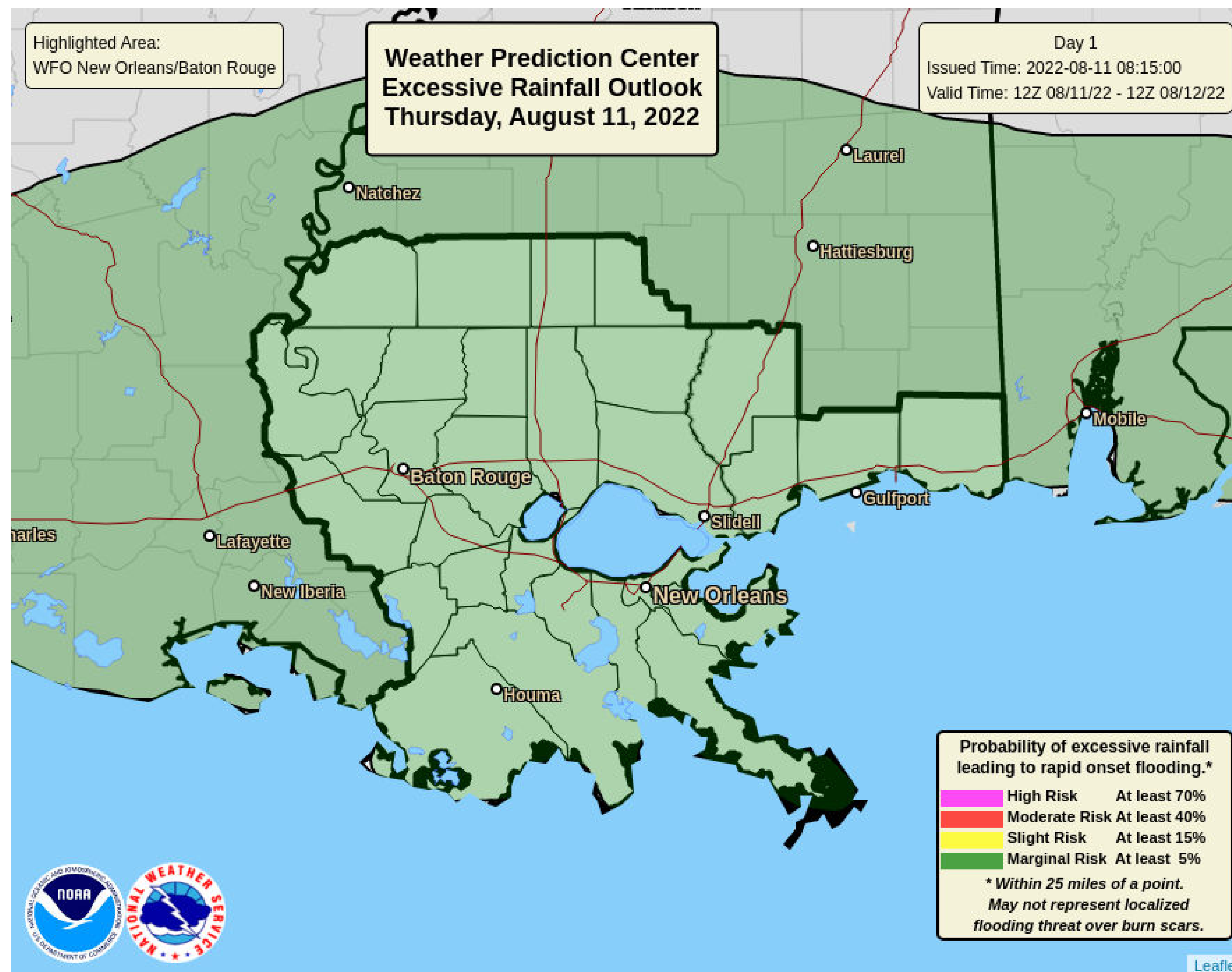
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Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Today and Tonight



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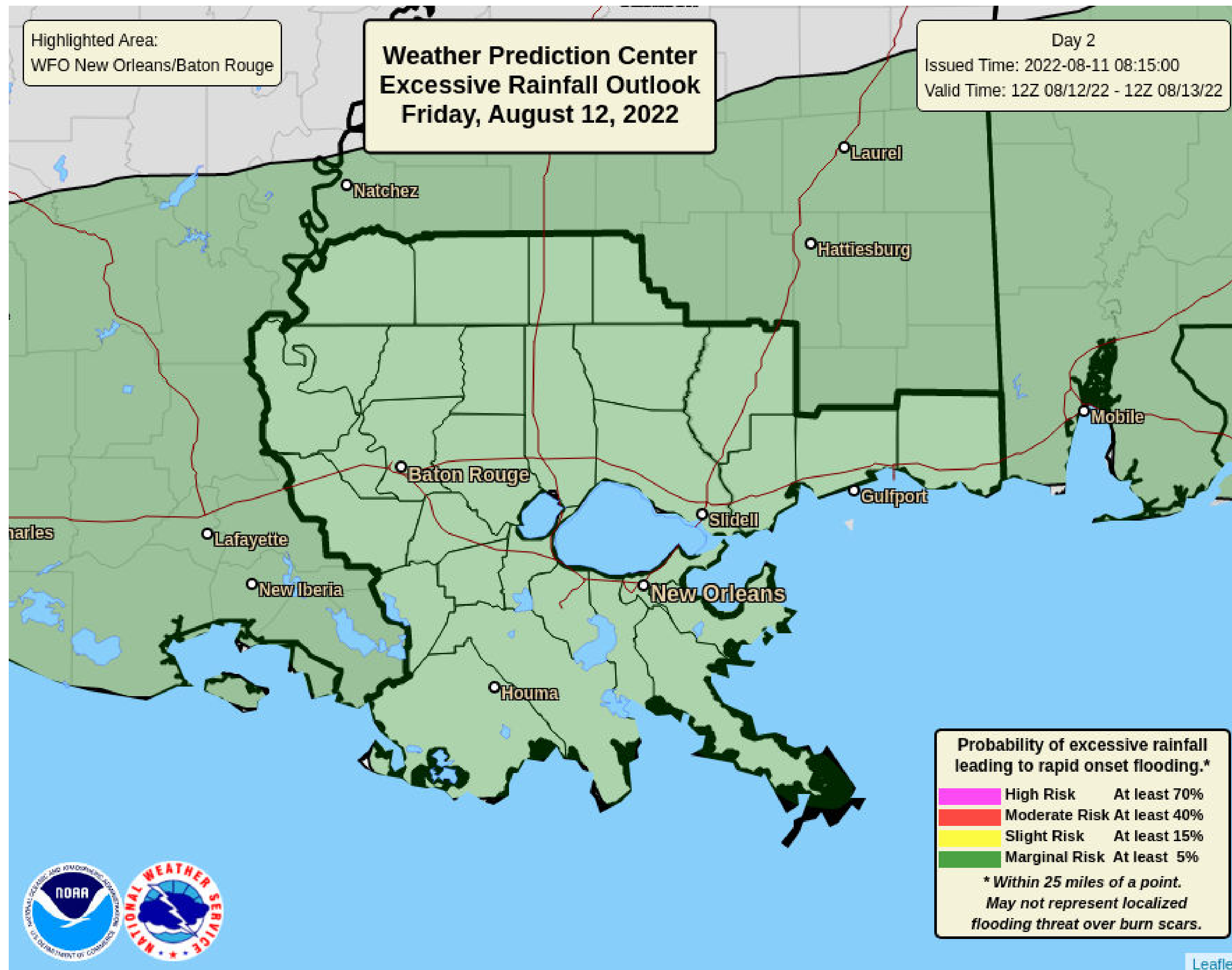
- Marginal risk of excessive rainfall areawide today and tonight.
- Rainfall may produce localized flooding, especially over urbanized or other flood prone areas.

Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Tomorrow and Tomorrow Night



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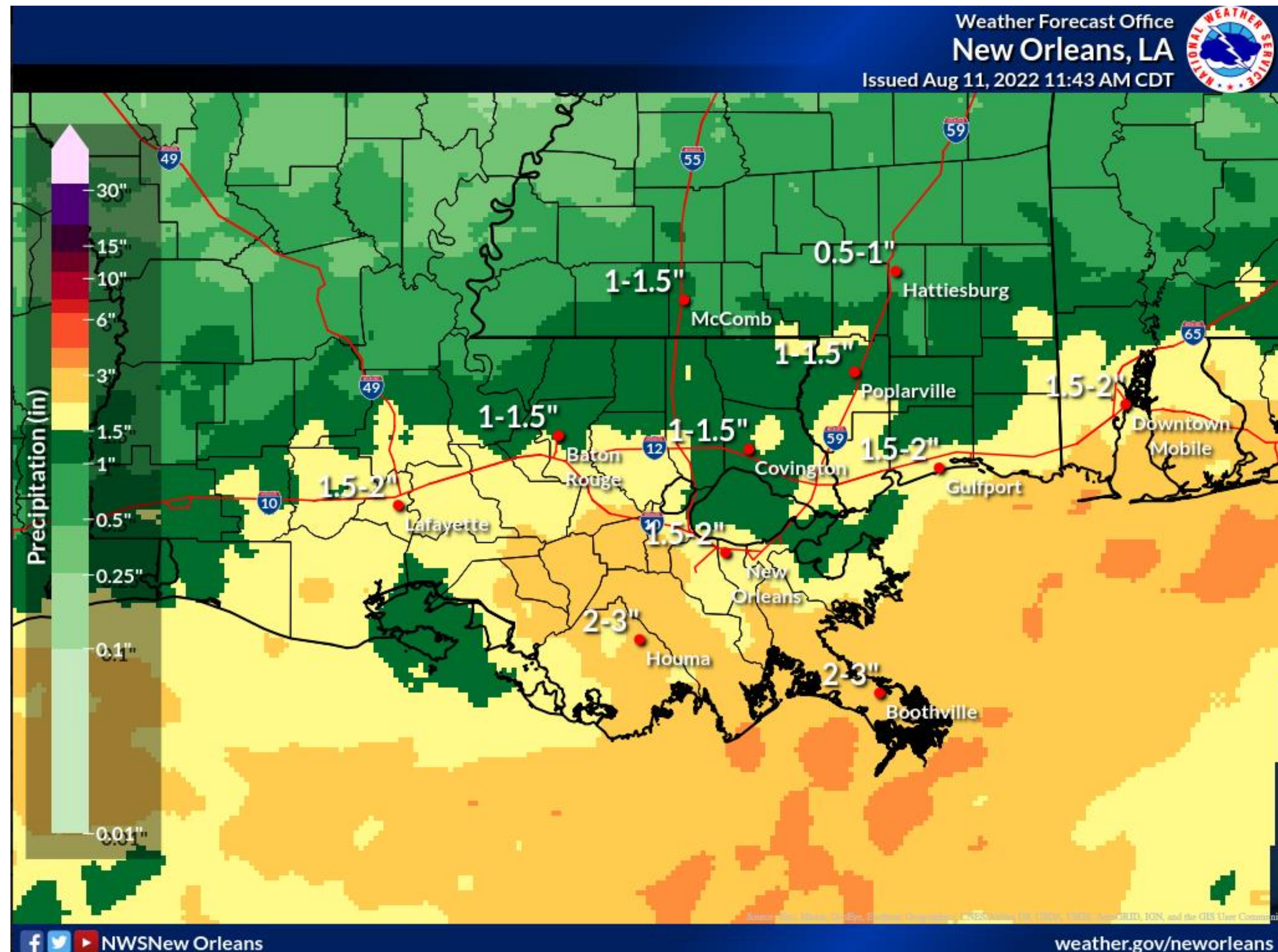
- More excessive rainfall on Friday again for the entire forecast area. Localized flooding will continue to remain possible.

Storm Total Rainfall Forecast

Valid Thursday through Wednesday



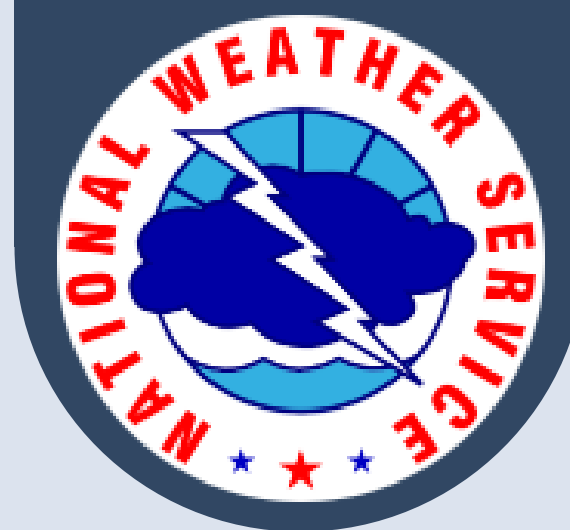
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- Rainfall generally one to three inches over the next week. Locally higher amounts expected in thunderstorms.
- Best odds late this week and into the weekend.



- Summerlike pattern continues with daily showers and thunderstorms expected. Heavy rainfall is the primary threat with localized urban flooding possible over the next few days.
- Coastal Flood Advisory expires at 7pm tonight. Should continue to improve through the weekend.
