

- A return of the rainy weather pattern is expected.
- Localized flash flooding will be a concern this weekend and likely into next week...especially in more urbanized areas.
- Flooding on the Pearl River will continue to impact low lying neighborhoods near Slidell through the middle of next week.
- No tropical threats for the area through the end of next week.



Tropical Weather Outlook




- Tropics are a bit more active. TS Danielle formed this morning in the North Atlantic
- No impacts to the area are expected through the end of next week.



Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Tomorrow and Tomorrow Night




- High rainfall rates of 2 to 3 inches per hour could cause localized flash flooding concerns.
- The threat exists across all of SE LA and S MS. Higher threat in lower lying and poorly drained urbanized areas.
- Highest threat will occur from late morning through the afternoon hours.




Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Saturday and Saturday Night



- High rainfall rates of 3 to 4 inches per hour could cause localized flash flooding concerns.
- Highest threat will be west of a Poplarville to New Orleans to Montegut line, but overall threat is in place across the area.
- Highest threat will occur from the late morning through the evening hours.






Note: River forecasts include 24 hours of future rainfall. Additional rainfall beyond that time frame could result in changes to the forecast.
