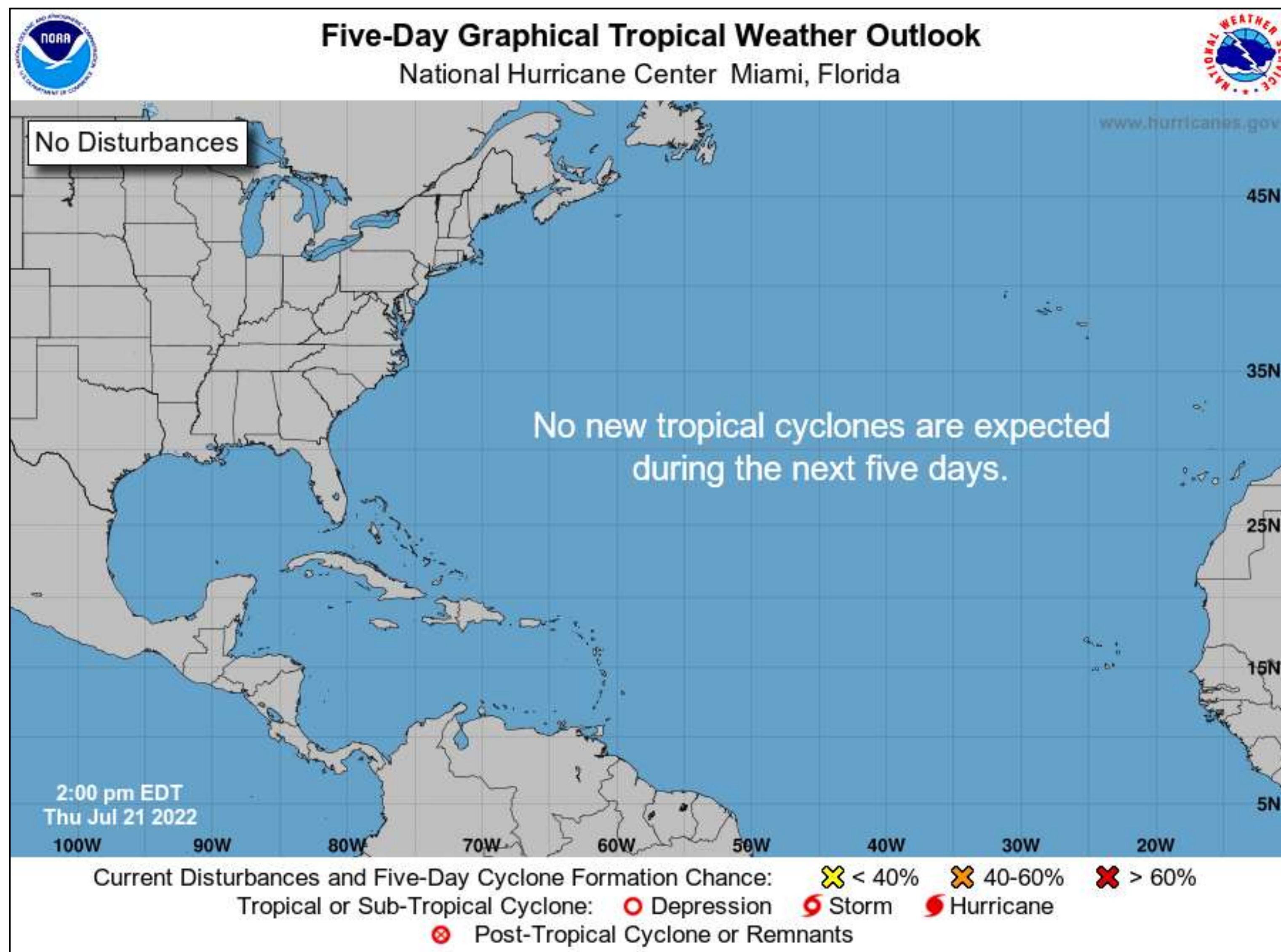
# Situation Overview

- Potential for Heat Advisories remains over the weekend and beyond





# Tropical Weather Outlook

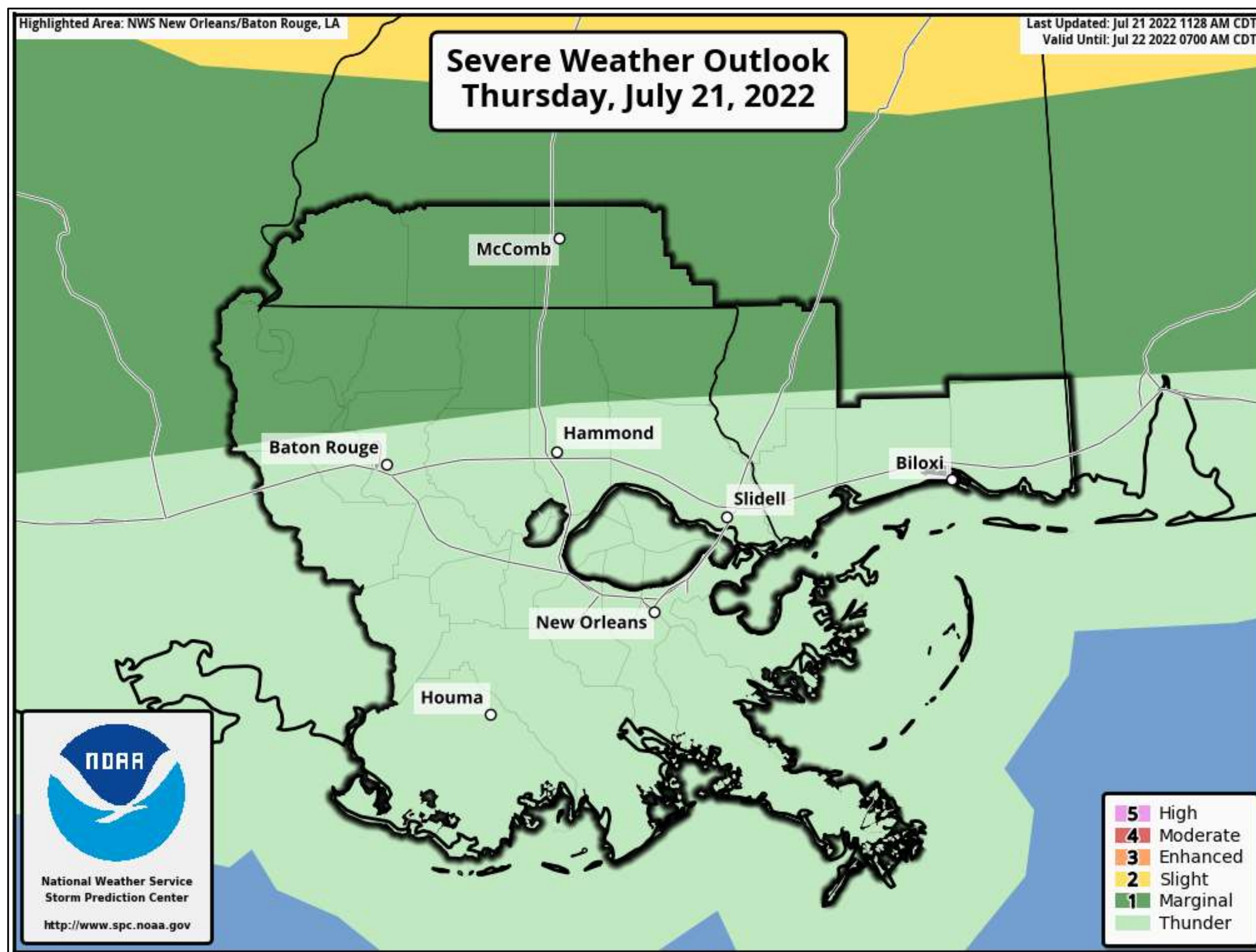


- Tropics remain quiet but still most of hurricane season to get through





# Severe Weather Outlook – Today



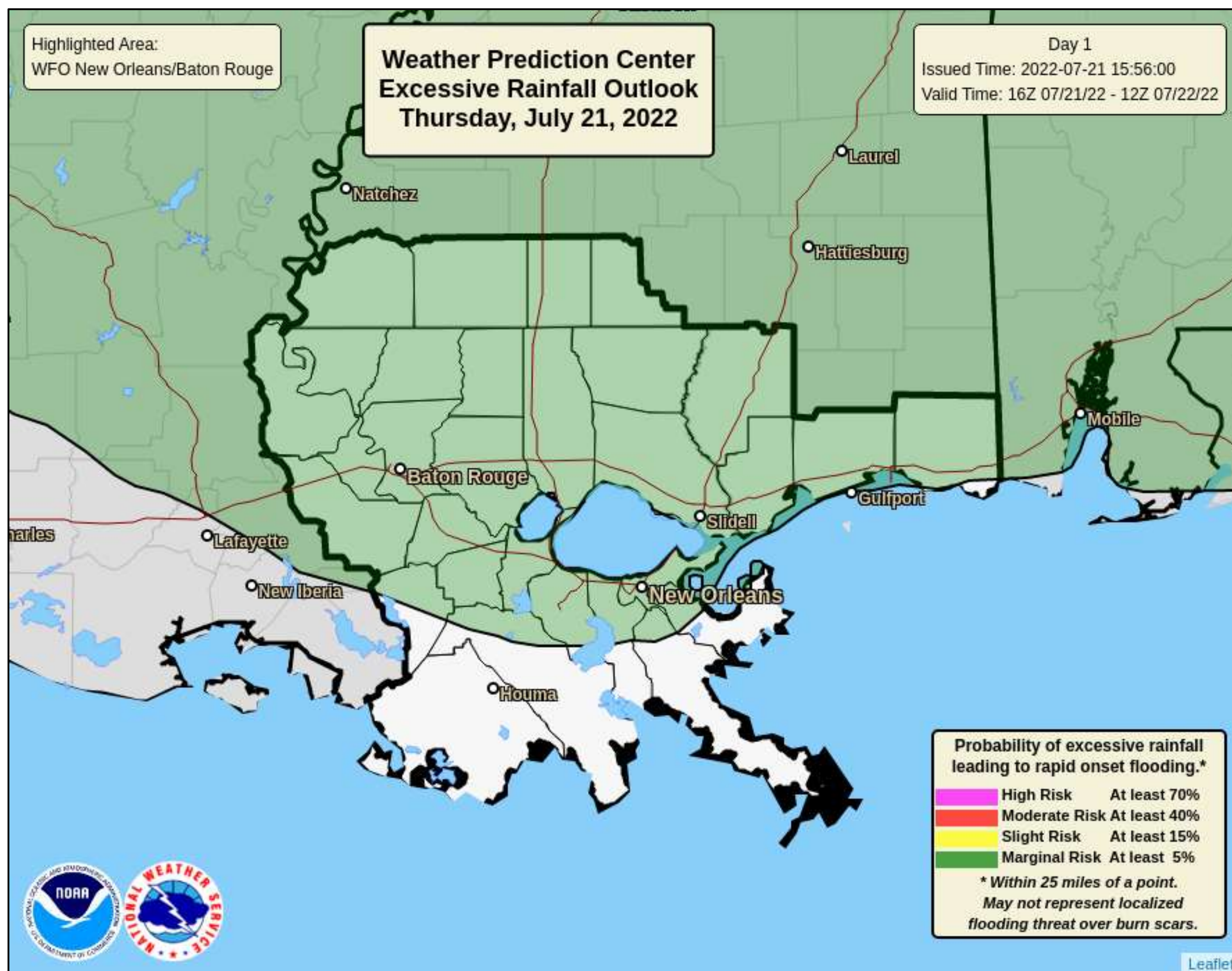
- Main threat damaging winds north of the I-10/12 corridor
- Threat diminishes this evening





# Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Today and Tonight



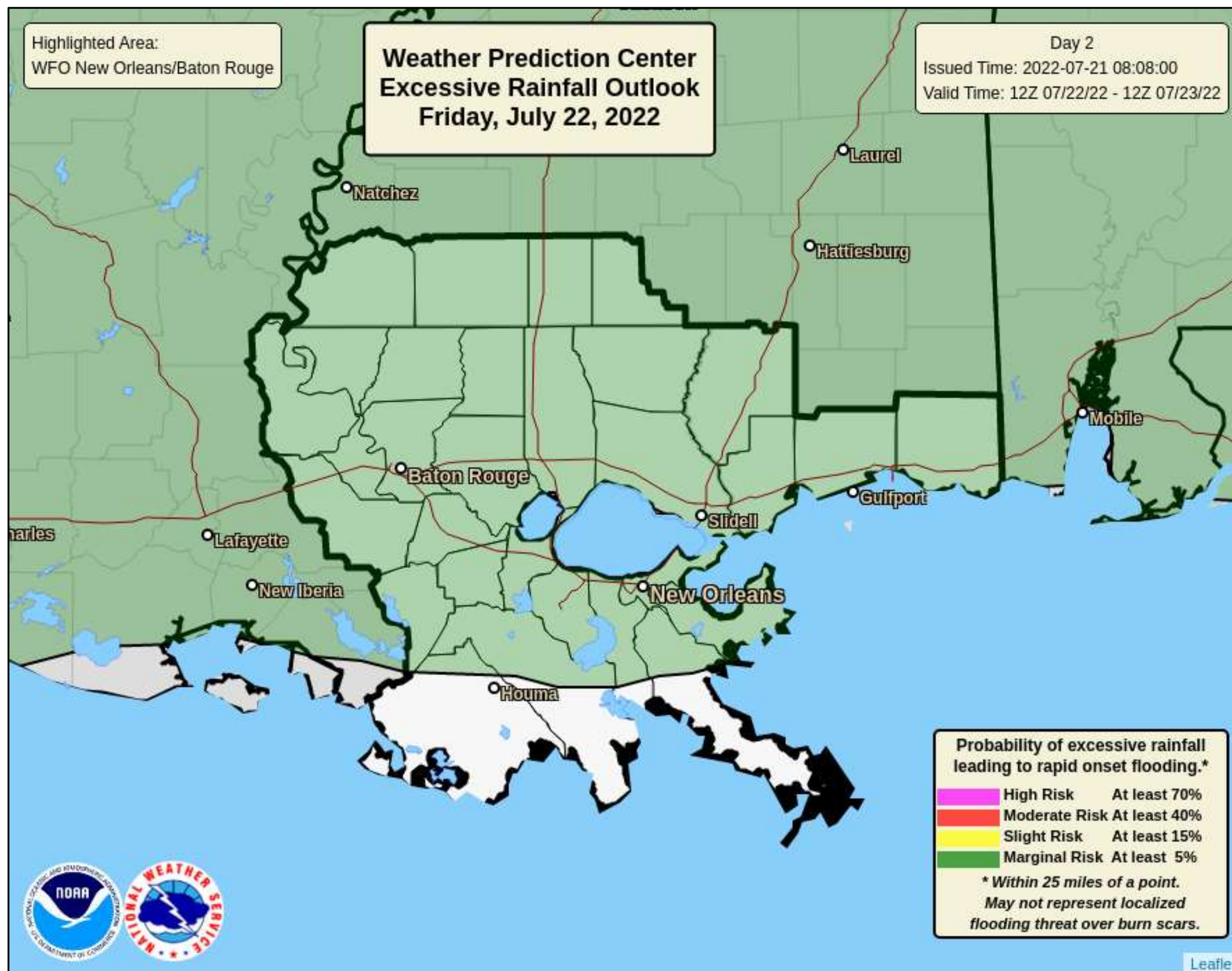
- Isolated very heavy rainfall with slow moving thunderstorms
- Main threat during afternoon and early evening





# Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Tomorrow and Tomorrow Night



- Isolated very heavy rainfall with slow moving thunderstorms
- Potential exists across most of S MS and SE LA, especially afternoon and early evening.
