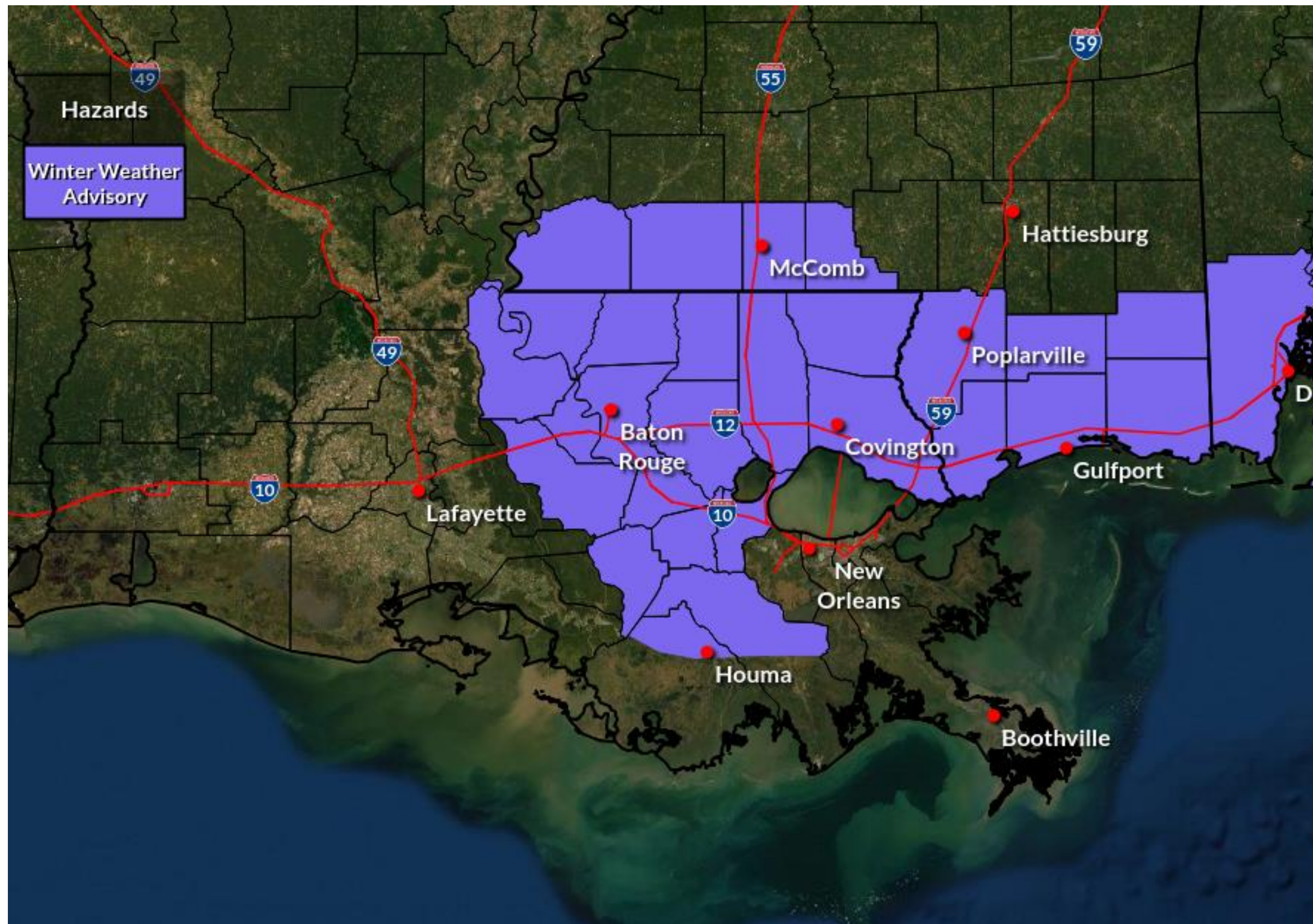


- Precipitation will be moving into the area overnight tonight into tomorrow morning.

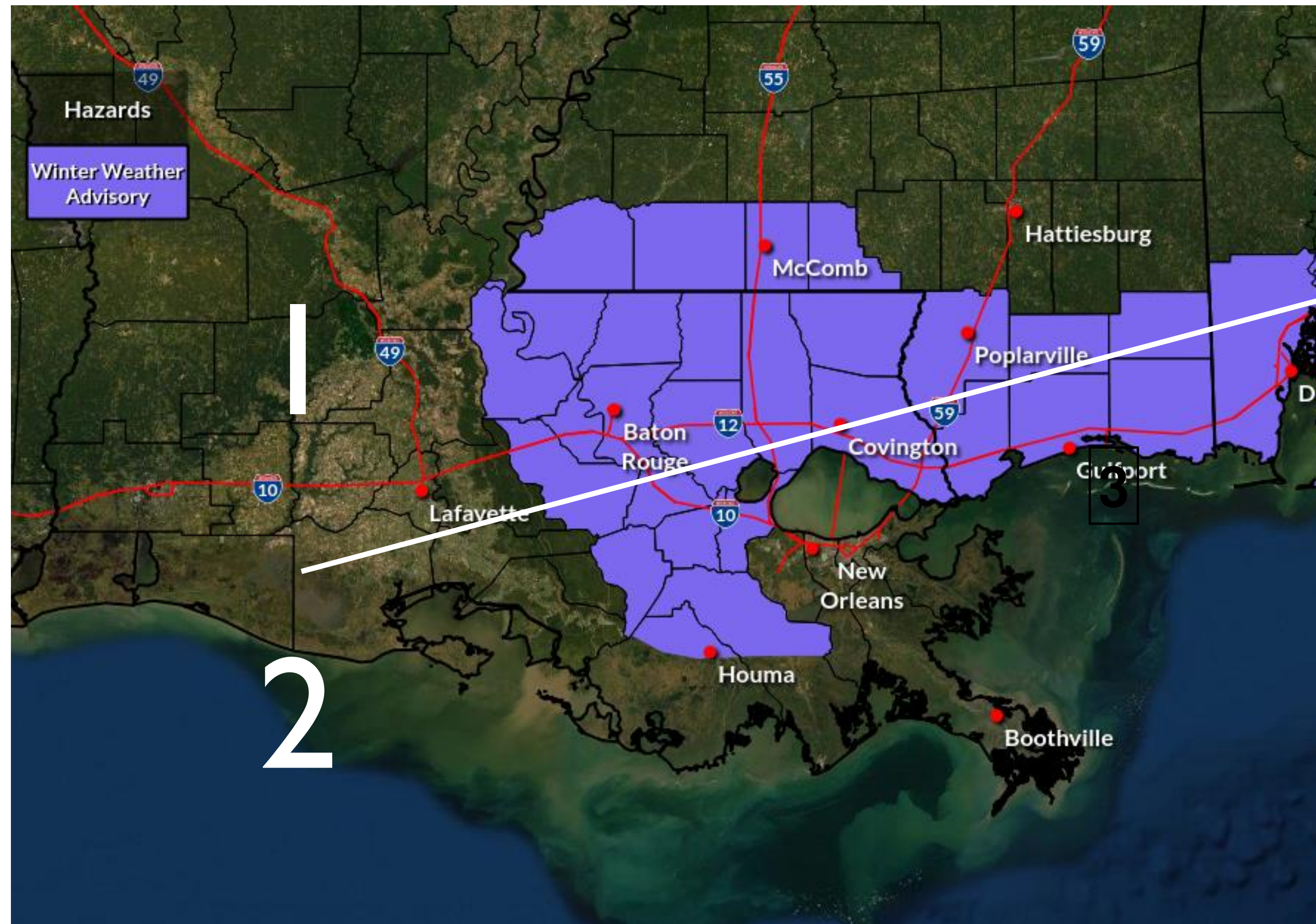


- While the threat of accumulating ice has decreased since yesterday, we are still forecasting light freezing rain/drizzle tonight into Friday morning across south Louisiana.
- A Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect for most of Southeastern Louisiana and all of SW and coastal MS.
- Does not include southshore areas.

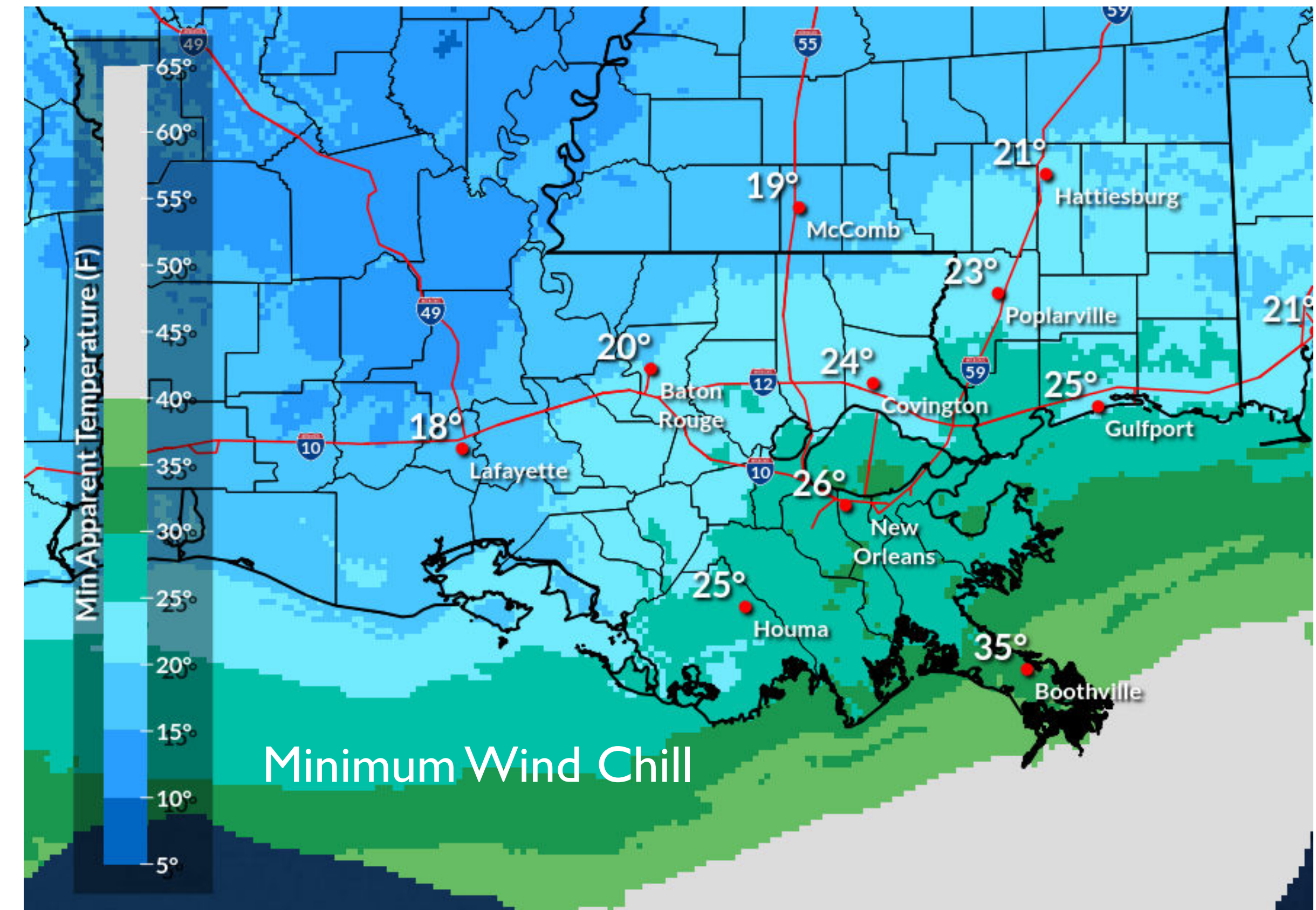

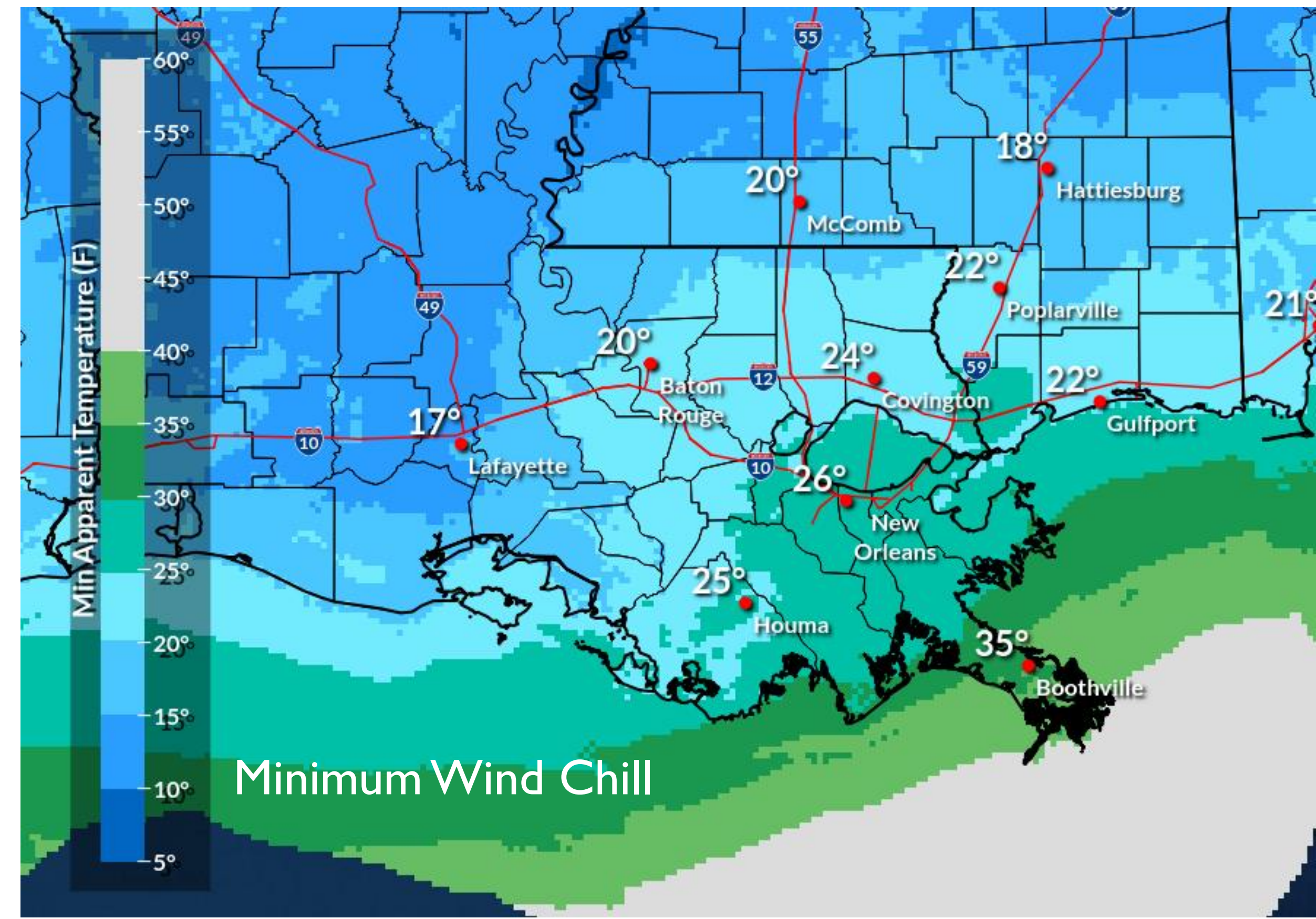
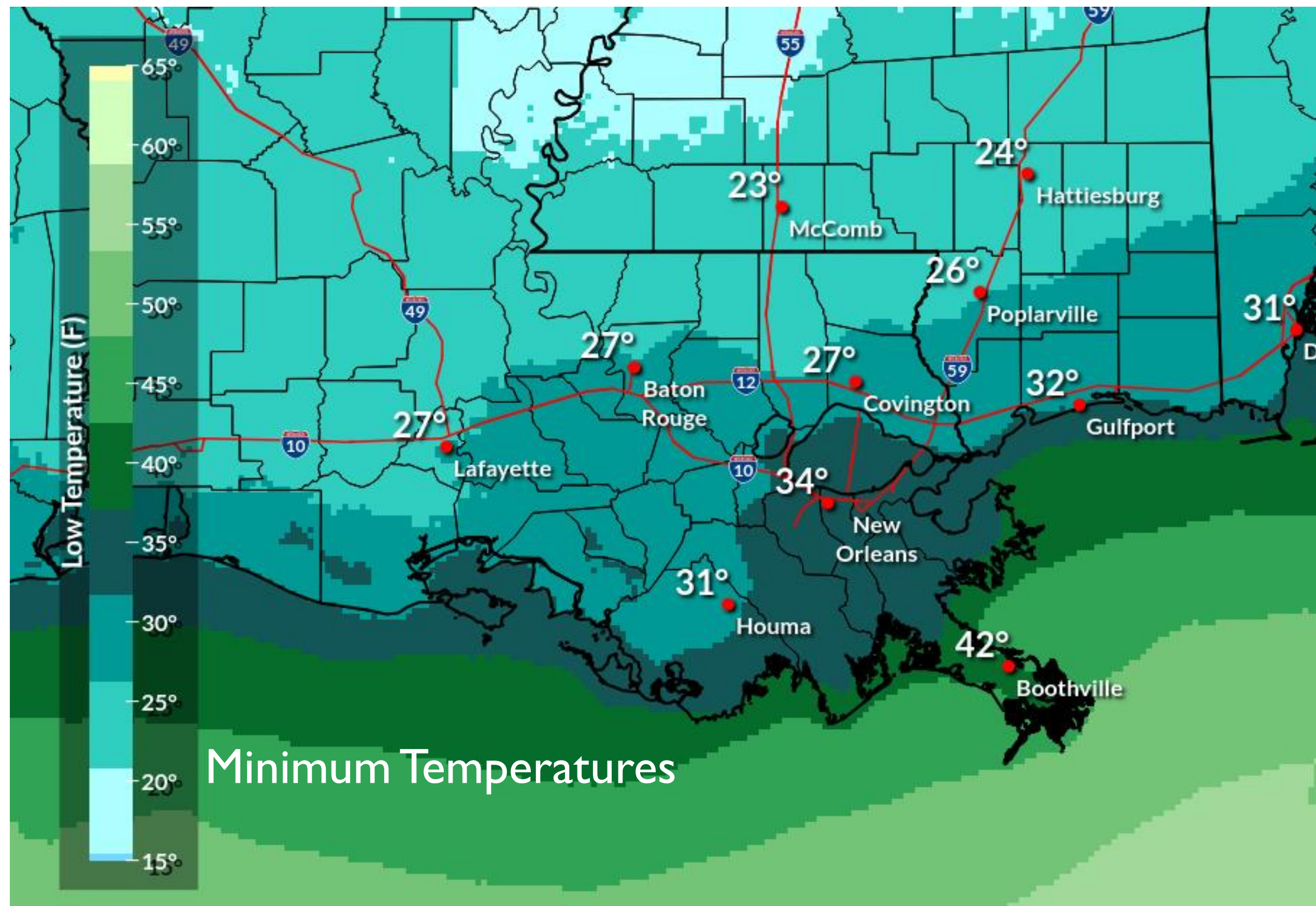


- Highs Friday will be in the low to mid 40s

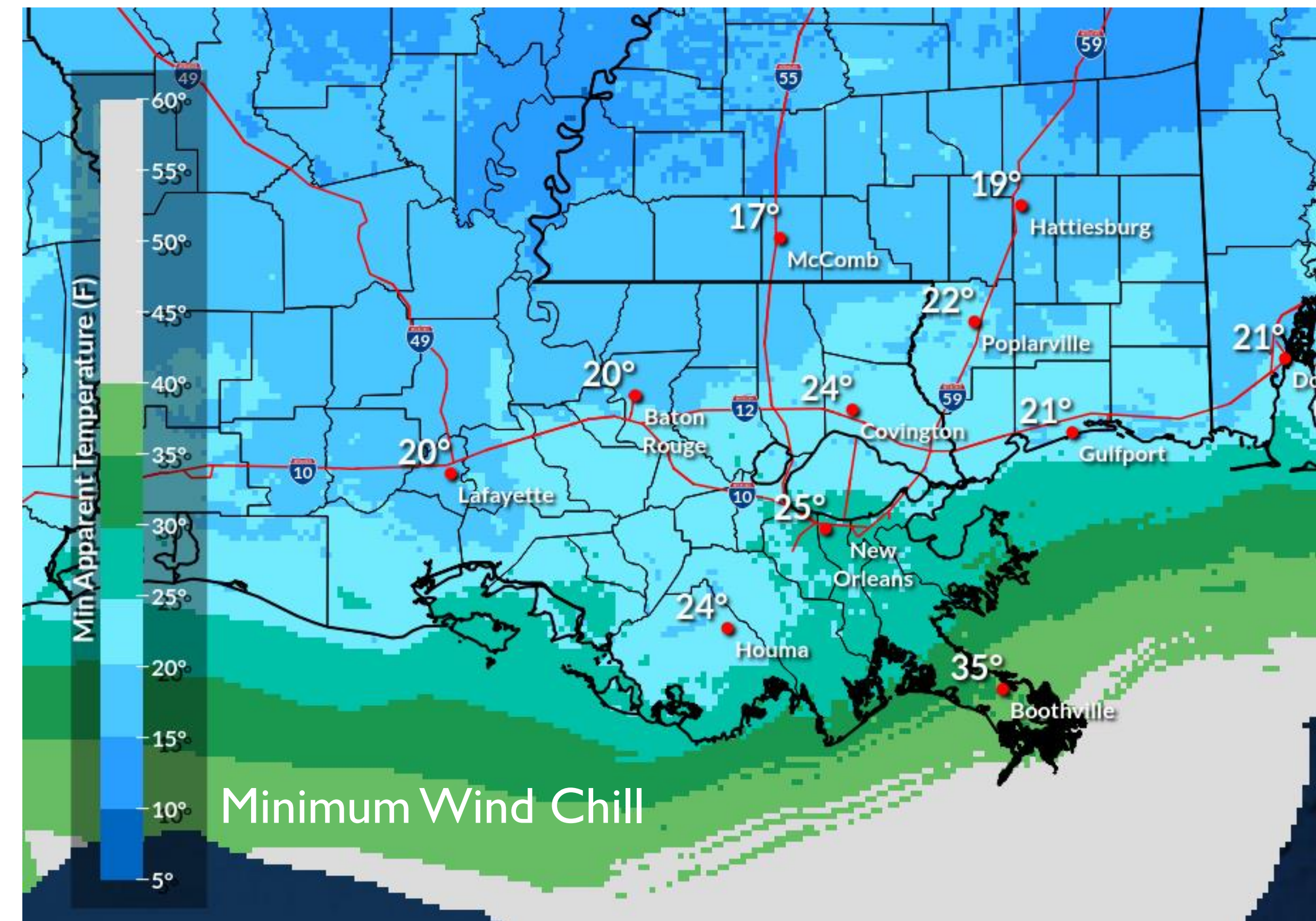
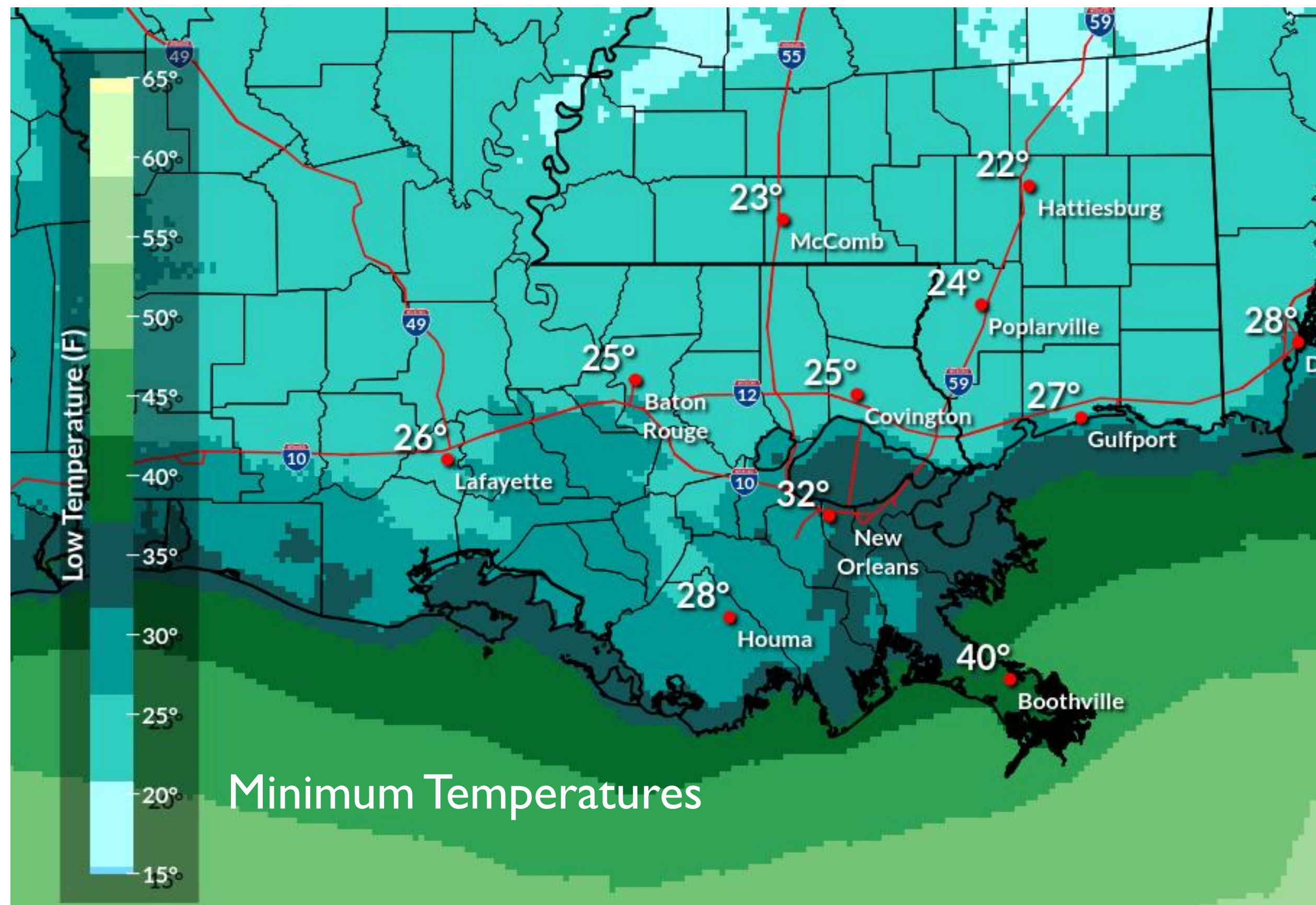


- Highs on Saturday will be in the upper 40s and low 50s

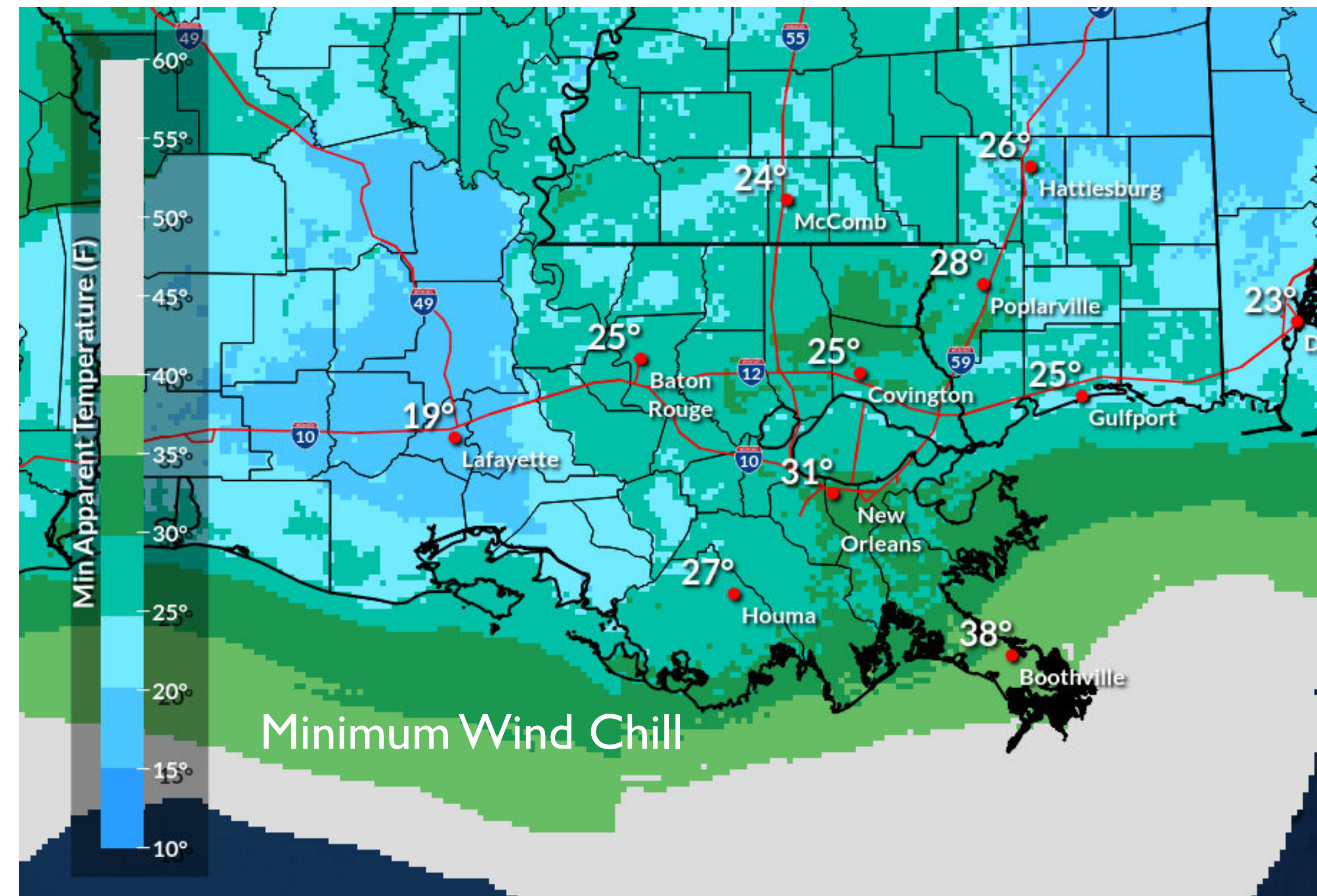
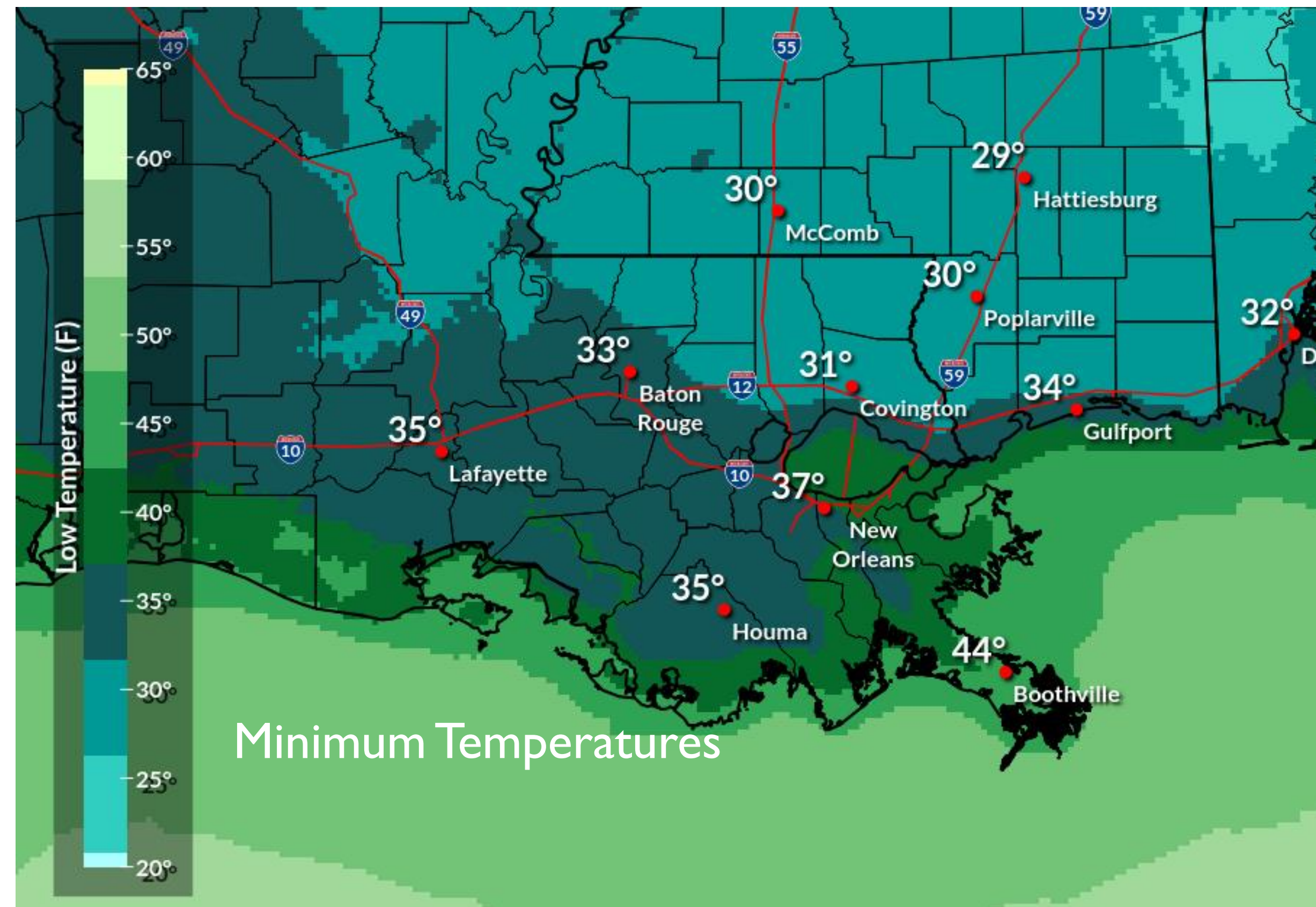


- Highs Sunday will be in the low 50s
