

- A summer-like pattern for the next few days, with showers and storms popping up late morning through the afternoon each day.
- Heavy Rain will be the main threat of the forecast.
- The tropics are active, but no local impacts.
- An uptick in temperatures is expected next week.



#### Excessive Rainfall Outlook


Valid through 7AM Friday



- We have a Marginal Risk of excessive rainfall today through Saturday.
- The entire CWA is under the risk each day. Rainfall rates of 3-4 in/hr could bring some localized flooding
- The main timing for any showers or storms that may bring this risk will be late morning through the afternoon.
- Average rainfall will be around 0.5-1.5 inches, but locally higher amounts are possible.




#### Tropical Weather Outlook




■ The tropics are active, but for now no local impacts are expected from any of these systems/disturbances.



## Day 6-10 Temperature Outlook




- Temperatures are expected to increase again next week.
- This will be most likely in areas that do not see as much rain coverage.






#### Day 6-10 Rainfall Outlook




 Still leaning above for rainfall in the extended period as tropical moisture looks to hang around.






### Drought Monitor



- Most places still abnormally dry or in drought, but this does not include any of the heavy air from the last couple days.
- Next week's graphic should look a little better with all the rain we're having.



- Heavy rain will continue to be a threat over the next few days and possibly lingering into next week as well.
- Tropics are active, but no local impacts are expected.
- Temperatures look to trend up some into next week.
