BE IT RESOLVED by the Parish Council of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority (the "Governing Authority"), of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana, (the "Parish"), as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Governing Authority does now proceed in open and public session to examine the official certified tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the Parish on Saturday, March 25, 2017 (the "Election"), said tabulations having been prepared and certified by the election officials serving at the designated polling places, and the Governing Authority does now further proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the Election.

SECTION 2. That a Proces Verbal of the canvass of the returns of the Election shall be made and that a certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, who shall record the same in his office; that another certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Clerk of Court and ex-officio Recorder of Mortgages in and for the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana, who shall record the same in the Mortgage Records of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana; and that another copy thereof shall be retained in the archives of the Parish.

PROCES VERBAL OF THE CANVASS OF THE VOTES CAST AT THE ELECTION HELD IN THE PARISH OF TANGIPAHOA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, ON SATURDAY, MARCH 25, 2017.

BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED that on the 10th day of April, 2017 at 5:30 p.m., at the Tangipahoa Parish Courthouse Annex, 206 East Mulberry Street, Amite, Louisiana, the Parish Council of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority (the "Governing Authority"), of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), and being the authority ordering the election held therein on Saturday, March 25, 2017, did examine and canvass the returns of the election, there having been submitted at the election the following proposition, to-wit:

PARISHWIDE PROPOSITION

Shall the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana (the "Parish") be authorized to levy a special tax of five (5) mills on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$2,641,995.00 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) (the "Tax") in lieu of the three (3) mills ad valorem tax currently being levied for the same purposes, for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the tax collection for the year 2018, and annually thereafter, to and including the year 2027, and shall said Tax (after

paying reasonable and necessary expenses of collecting and administering the Tax) be used entirely and exclusively for the purpose of improving, maintaining, operating and supporting the Tangipahoa Parish Public Library and its branches?
