AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE A COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE TANGIPAHOA PARISH COUNCIL-PRESIDENT GOVERNMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONS, PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES, OFFICE OF STATE FIRE MARSHALL REGARDING THE “LOUISIANA STATE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE PLAN REVIEW”

WHEREAS, the Tangipahoa Parish Council-President Government would like to enter into an agreement with the Office of the State Fire Marshall for the use of the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code Plan;

T.P. ORDINANCE NO. 17-56

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE INCURRING OF DEBT AND ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF NOT EXCEEDING ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$180,000) OF TAXABLE SEWER REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2017, OF THE PARISH OF TANGIPAHOA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, ALL IN THE MANNER PROVIDED FOR BY CHAPTER 14 OF TITLE 30 OF THE LOUISIANA REVISED STATUTES OF 1950, AS AMENDED, AND OTHER CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTORY AUTHORITY SUPPLEMENTAL THERETO; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Parish Council of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), that:

Authorization and Sale of Bond. Pursuant to Section 7633 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 and Chapter 14 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and

statutory (collectively, the "Act"), and Parish of Tangipahoa, State of Louisiana, (the "Parish") is hereby authorized to incur debt for the purpose of loaning the proceeds to the Village of Tangipahoa (the "Village"), pursuant to the cooperative endeavor agreement, to be used for the purposes of (i) removing and replacing piping, valves, electrical controls and shelter at the Village's existing wastewater treatment facility main influent pump lift station; and (ii) replacing aspirator/mixers in the Village's wastewater treatment lagoon, and to represent said indebtedness, the Parish shall issue its Taxable Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2017, in an amount not exceeding One Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$180,000) (the "Bond" or "Bonds"). The Bonds shall be issued in the form of a single fully registered bond, dated the date of delivery thereof and numbered R-1. The Bond shall be non-interest bearing, and shall mature not later than twenty (20) years from date thereof. The principal of the Bond will be subject to forgiveness as provided in Section 0 below.

Pursuant to the Act, the Parish has determined to sell the Bonds at a private sale without the necessity of publishing any notice of sale. Accordingly, the Bond is hereby sold to the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, Clean Water State Revolving Fund (the "Department"). The purchase price of the Bond shall be paid to the Parish by the Department in installments on an "as-needed" basis, and the date and amount of each installment of the purchase price shall be noted on the Bond and the obligation of the Parish to repay the principal of the Bond shall only accrue to the extent of the purchase price of the Bond theretofore paid by the Department.

Form and Execution of Bond. The Bond shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, and the Chairman and Secretary of the Governing Authority are authorized and directed on behalf of the Parish to execute, seal and deliver the Bond to the Department.

Security for Bond; Principal Forgiveness. The Bond will be secured by and payable from the revenues derived by the Parish from a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (the "CEA") to be entered into with the Village concurrently with the issuance of the Bonds.

However, it is understood that the terms of the purchase of the Bond by the Department provide that the Parish's obligation to repay the principal of the Bond will be forgiven simultaneously with the payment by the Department of each installment of the purchase price of the Bond. Accordingly, it is anticipated that no payments of principal, interest or administrative fees to the Department will ever be due and payable on the Bonds. Notwithstanding any law or contractual provision to the contrary, the forgiveness at any time of any or all of the principal of the Bond theretofore advanced by the Department shall in no way extinguish the Bond or the obligation thereof with respect to the yet-to-be advanced portion of the principal thereof.

Loan Documents. The Commitment Agreement and the Loan & Pledge Agreement, in substantially the forms attached hereto as Exhibit B, are hereby approved, and the Chairman and Secretary of the Governing Authority are authorized to execute and deliver the aforesaid documents on behalf of the Parish, with such changes as may be deemed necessary, upon the advice of counsel, in connection with the Bond.

Authorization of Officers. The Chairman and Secretary of the Governing Authority are hereby further authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Parish, to accept, receive, execute, seal, attest and deliver the CEA and all such additional documents, certificates and other instruments as are required in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Bond and to take such further action as may be appropriate or required by law or advised by bond counsel in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Bond.

Employment of Bond Counsel. The governing authority finds and determines that a real necessity exists for the employment of special bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bond. Boles, Shafto & Leonard, LLC, of Monroe, Louisiana, is hereby employed as Bond Counsel to the Commission to do and perform comprehensive legal and co-ordinate professional work of a traditional legal nature with respect to the issuance and sale of the Bond. Said Bond Counsel shall prepare and submit to this governing authority for adoption all of the proceedings incidental to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Bond, shall counsel and advise this governing authority as to the issuance and sale thereof, and shall furnish their opinion covering the legality of the issuance thereof.

The fee of Bond Counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bond is hereby fixed at a sum not to exceed the fees provided by the Attorney General's Guidelines for Fees and Services of Bond Attorneys for comprehensive legal and coordinate professional work in the issuance of revenue bonds, said fee to be payable solely out of funds derived from the sale of the Bond and to be contingent upon the issuance, sale and delivery thereof. A certified copy of this ordinance shall be forwarded to the Attorney General of the State of Louisiana for his written approval of said employment and of the fees herein designated.

Bond Counsel and the Financial Advisor appointed below are hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the issuance of the Bond and Bond Counsel is authorized and directed to prepare necessary documents appertaining thereto and to present them for further action by this Governing Authority.

Appointment of Financial Advisor. Government Consultants of Louisiana, Inc., of Baton Rouge, Louisiana is hereby appointed and employed as financial advisor in connection with the Bond, any compensation to be subsequently approved by the Parish and to be paid from the proceeds of the Bond and contingent upon issuance of the Bond.

Other Professionals. Should it be necessary to engage other professionals, the Manager shall be entitled to engage such professionals provided the contracts employing such professionals shall be promptly submitted to the Parish.

Publication; Peremption. A copy of this ordinance shall be published immediately after its adoption in one issue of the official journal of the Parish, provided that the exhibits to this ordinance (the form of Bond, the Commitment Agreement and the Loan & Pledge Agreement) need not be published but will instead be available for public inspection at the office of the Secretary during regular business hours on weekdays.

For a period of thirty (30) days from the date of such publication any person in interest shall have the right to contest the legality of this ordinance or of the Bond and the provisions securing the Bond. After the expiration of said thirty (30) days, no one shall have any right of action to contest the validity of the Bond or the provisions of this ordinance, and the Bond shall be conclusively presumed to be legal, and no court shall thereafter have authority to inquire into such matters.

No Recourse on the Bond. No recourse shall be had for the payment of the Bond or for any claim based thereon or on this ordinance against any member of the Governing Authority or officer of the Parish or any person executing the Bond.

Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
