



Tangipahoa Parish Transit Title VI Non-Discrimination

Policy Statement

In compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Tangipahoa Parish Government operates all of its programs and provides public transportation services without regard to race, color, or national origin. Tangipahoa Parish is committed to providing non-discriminatory service that is open to the general public. Tangipahoa Parish is committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from access to its transit services on the basis of race, color, or national origin. Also, under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Tangipahoa Parish shall not discriminate against an individual with a physical or mental disability in connection with the provision of transportation service. Anyone who believes that they have been subject to an unlawful discriminatory practice by Tangipahoa Parish has the right to file a complaint with the Tangipahoa Parish Government.
